Word Used in Context

I mounted a fan on the *ceiling* to circulate cool air.

Marsha loved the high *ceiling* and hardwood floor of her historic apartment.

The sprinklers on the *ceiling* of the school building will spray water if there is a fire.

COT Pronunciation kot

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a small narrow bed that can be folded up and put

away

Word Used in Context

The *cot* was uncomfortable to sleep on, but it was much better than the ground.

Fred's feet hung over the end of the tiny *cot*.

My grandmother set up a *cot* for me to sleep on during my visit.

COTTON Pronunciation kot-uhn
Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 cloth made from the fluffy white fibers surrounding the

seed pods of a certain plant

Word Used in Context

The *cotton* my mother used to make my summer dress was thin and soft.

The *cotton* was wrinkled when I pulled it from the dryer. Jeans, sheets, and socks all can be made of *cotton*.

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DINOSAUR

Pronunciation dye-nuh-sor

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 any of a group of large reptiles that lived on land in

prehistoric times

Word Used in Context

A lizard looks like a tiny *dinosaur*.

Scientists believe that at least one kind of *dinosaur* could fly.

"This *dinosaur* looks like it could eat people," said the teacher, "but it only

ate prehistoric plants."

DUMP

Pronunciation duhmp

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a place where unwanted things can be left, as in the

garbage

Word Used in Context

The junk mail we throw away ends up in the city dump.

The broken furniture could not be fixed and Raoul carried it to the *dump*.

There were four rusty tractors in the *dump* behind the barn.

FOUNTAIN

Pronunciation foun-tuhn

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a stream or jet of water used for drinking or for

decoration

Word Used in Context

The *fountain* in the courtyard is a popular background for photographs.

The park *fountain* shoots water high into the air.

The children splashed in the *fountain* to cool themselves.

HOWL

Pronunciation houl

Part of Speech verb

Definition 1 to make a loud, sad noise

Word Used in Context

We knew something bad had happened when we heard Trish howl.

The *howl* of a wolf can be frightening if you are all alone.

Amanda's dog will *howl* if left outside.

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JUNGLE Pronunciation juhng-guhl

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 land in warm, tropical areas near the equator that is

thickly covered with trees, vines, and bushes

Word Used in Context

A jungle is a place where it is difficult to build roads, because it has so

many bushes and trees.

There are more species of animals in the *jungle* than in any other place. Simon got lost in the *jungle* because the trees all looked the same to him.

MIDNIGHT Pronunciation mid-nite

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 twelve o'clock in the middle of the night

Word Used in Context

The clock announces that it is *midnight* with twelve chimes.

The countdown to *midnight* is a popular tradition on New Year's Eve.

Cinderella had to be home from the ball by *midnight*.

TIGER Pronunciation tye-gur

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a large, striped, wild cat that lives in Asia

Word Used in Context

The hungry *tiger* hunted for a deer to eat.

The new circus tiger came from India.

The lion is the biggest cat, but the *tiger* is almost as large.


